KEY DEVELOPMENTS

- State of emergency declared in January of 2019 due to drought - 2.3 million people affected
- The World Bank approved a package worth \$1.320 billion to support the government of Angola in its efforts to promote more inclusive growth, improve water services, and strengthen the economy
- The salaries of more than 48,000 primary education teachers earning 49,000 kwanza was raised to 238,321 kwanza, in line with newly approved payment chart for public servants.
- The International Monetary Fund (IMF) approved new financing of US\$248.15 million for Angola.

KEY HIGHLIGHTS

- Expansion of the nutrition programme to include Out Patient Therapeutic Programme (OTP) interventions
- Midyear programme evaluation done
- Five WASH hand pump technicians trained to repair all non functional boreholes in JAM operational areas.

CHALLENGES

- Poor connectivity affects communication
- Some schools are inaccessible for JAM to conduct routine support and supervision visits.
- Lack of funds for JAM to spearhead periodic nutrition sectoral coordination
- A number of non functional boreholes that collapsed did not have full casing to protect and support the wellstream/drilled borehole.
