KEY DEVELOPMENTS

- A peace agreement was signed between the Mozambican government and rebel group (Renamo) on 6 Aug 19 to end the armed conflict that began in 2015
- The northern province of Cabo Delgado continues to be unsafe as an Islamic rebel group continues to slaughter people. To date over 300 people have been killed.
- Presidential and legislative elections will take place on 15 Oct 2019
- Despite the economic crisis, the average growth of the economy has been about 4%

KEY HIGHLIGHTS

- JAM food processing factory achieved ISO 22000 certification
- 48 schools received PTA training focusing on improving the quality of education
- Over 353,300 JAM CSB meals were distributed to over 18,329 beneficiaries
- Successful Cyclone Idai emergency response
- 15,120 boxes of fortified Manna pack rice received for post Idai relief distribution in Dondo and Grudja resettlement centres
- JAM successfully repaired the damages to the factory after Cyclone Idai.

CHALLENGES

- Increasing humanitarian needs post Cyclone Idai have put pressure on available resources
- 3% of schools in the school feeding programme do not have access to safe water
- Approximately 5000 people (near Matchenexe) do not have potable water and proper sanitation facilities, since the Cyclone and floods in March 2019
